Puerto Rico

Puerto Rico Department of Agriculture

The Puerto Rico Department of Agriculture is empowered to designate harmful species and whose introduction, possession, acquisition, sale or transfer in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico must be prohibited. The Department is authorized to establish through regulation the conditions under which the introduction and the movement in Puerto Rico of plants and plant products or vegetative material for propagation from outside the Commonwealth.

Puerto Rico Department of Conservation

The Puerto Rico Department of Conservation has the powers and duties necessary to protect the fishery resources so that they may be used by the People of Puerto Rico.

Invasive Plants	Upon written notification by Secretary of Agriculture of a declaration of public nuisance the owner or person in charge of the place of the nuisance is obliged to destroy the plant pest, plant, plant product, or vegetative material, without any compensation, if satisfactory treatment is not possible.
